<u>Conservative political elites</u> play a decisive role in determining whether fledgling democracies flourish or die.







A TALE OF TWO DEMOCRACIES Responding to Demands of the Populace

Emerging Democracies

A century ago, in all countries with <u>expanding voter</u> <u>franchises</u>:

- Conservative parties struggled to maintain their historical defense of elite privilege.
- When suffrage was restricted, conservative parties could ignore the massive gap between the rich and the rest.
- But this became a losing game once the working class gained the vote.

Britain

"In Britain, the conservatives found a way to retain their power.

- They fashioned a robust party organization that could appeal to the poor as well as the rich, and everyone in between. . . . "
- The Tories managed to do this while making only modest economic concessions.







A TALE OF TWO COUNTRIES Responding to Demands of the Populace

Germany

"In Germany, unlike Britain, rightwing elites and their political allies failed to manage the **Conservative Dilemma . . "**

The Weimar Republic was the German state from 1918 to 1933 when it functioned as a federal constitutional republic.



"Their choices helped unleash forces of extremism that first captured and then fractured their own party.

From this weakened position, they foolishly partnered with a political outsider particularly skilled at stoking racism, tribalism, and fear. In doing so, they opened the door to Nazism and world war."











The "Invasion" Ads



Beginning January 2019, the Trump campaign has posted over 2,000, now inactive, Facebook ads centered around immigration that featured the word "invasion" as part of the reelection team's vast and high-dollar digital ad strategy, as first reported by <u>The New York Times</u>.

Risks of the Cultural Cleavage Strategy

The conservative party's embrace of strategies of cultural division introduces <u>two great risks</u>:


1.) Risk of Capture

"The conservative party may become vulnerable to capture by outside organizations that specialize in generating outrage."

2.) Risk of Diminishing Commitment to Democracy

"If the party's appeals to voters is not enough, they may attempt to shift the electoral math more directly by bending or breaking those rules."

"What has happened to the United States over the past five years is, in many ways, a **classic of the autocratic genre**. A populist leader:

- rose to power
- attacked the press
- politicized rule of law
- threatened to jail his opponents
- demonized minorities
- praised dictators abroad
- spread conspiracy theories and lies, and then
- sought to seize power despite losing an election.

When such despotic figures emerge in democracies, their political party has two options:

- 1. push back against the would-be despot while reasserting democratic principles or
- 2. remake the party in his image.

Republicans have clearly chosen the latter path.



The Risk of "Capture" has Come True

The big question is: Can this be reversed? Can Republicans go back to being a broadly prodemocracy party that operates within democratic constraints and accepts election defeats without inventing false claims?

There are a few ways political parties that drift toward authoritarianism can be brought back from the brink. Sadly, none of them can save the modern GOP."







- Shorten window to apply for a mail ballot.
- Shorten deadline to deliver mail ballot.
- Make it harder to remain on absentee voting list.
- Prohibit sending ballot applications to all voters.
- Restrict assistance in returning a voter's mail ballot.
- Limit mail ballot drop boxes.
- Impose stricter signature requirements for ballots.
- Impose harsher voter ID requirements.
- Expand voter purges.
- Increase barriers for voters with disabilities.
- Eliminate Election Day registration.
- Reduce polling place availability (location or hours).
- Limit early voting days or hours.
- Increase number of voters per precinct.

Option #3 – Who Decides on the Strategy?



A L E C The American Legislative Exchange Council 501(c4)(c3) Estab. 1973

- Legislative members are state and federal legislators.
- Corporate members are representatives of the major U.S. corporations, conservative think tanks, and industry associations and institutes.
- Model bills: Forum allows members to write model bills. Member legislators can then use these model bills as templates for their own bill.
 Corporate "Feedback": Meetings are an opportunity for the corporate and non-profit leaders to meet and provide feedback to legislators.

Option #3 – Who's Decided to End our Democracy?

A L E C - Large, private interests seeking economic liberty . . . for themselves.

Translated as "cordoning off capital and property from the control of everyday Americans, i.e., permanently protecting their wealth and associated power.

Nancy McLean describes it as "the insulation of private property rights from the reach of government."

"Economic Liberty"

- 1. Reduce taxes as low as possible (ideally zero)







Extreme Economic Inequality Creates Three Risks for Democracy

1. Unequal Power

- Wealth provides enormous political advantage.
- Skews access to the centers of power and to the law.
- Creates a profound sense of "unfairness".


2. Divergent Interests

- Wealth may create less commitment to the nation
- Plutocrats can live anywhere.
- Multi-national companies can locate their operations anywhere.

3. Elite Fear


• Those with great wealth fear the vote and potential actions of those without.







Dominant-Party Dictatorship

A dominant-party dictatorship is an authoritarian regime in which:

- A single political party controls leadership selection and policy.
- Members of the party hold the majority of key political positions.
- Regime elites typically come from the party's ruling body, often referred to as a politburo or central committee.



Personalism

Personalism refers to the domination of the political realm by a <u>single individual</u>.


- The leader's personality has an outsized impact on policies, frequently outstripping institutions and rules.
- The leader governs absent the restraints of other actors.
- Personalist leaders are not a new phenomenon – think ancient Egypt, Roman emperors or Czars of Russia.
- Influence waned in the late 20th century as democracies grew and autocracies became more diversified in their leadership structure



The Incremental Nature of Authoritarianization

Authoritarianization

As with democratic backsliding more generally, the gradual nature of authoritarianization can make it difficult to identify.

Doing so requires attention to political developments taking place in many arenas.



Worrisome signs:

- 1. Placement of incumbent loyalists in high positions of power
- 2. Attempt to take control of the media
- 3. Manipulating electoral rules to favor the incumbent.
- 4. Use of lawsuits and legislation to sideline civil society and opponents.
- 5. Passing constitutional amendments to benefit the incumbent

The "Populist" Playbook





The Populist aims to divide the nation into the "Real People" and the "enemies responsible for the nation's ills."

He claims he and only he can speak for "people" a group that excludes are large number of citizens with different identities.

He and only he can save the nation and restore to its once greatness!

His populist followers are imagined to be the moral soul of the nation, the founders, the "real" and only legitimate tribe. The "Moral Majority" or the "Silent Majority."







Despite their pronouncements about freedom, high RWA lawmakers would like to pass laws that restrict freedom of the press, the right to protest, the right to privacy, the right to belong to political organizations of one's choice, reproductive rights and certainly, freedom of religion.



The Modern Method of Destroying a Democracy

- 1. Demonize the opposition as illegitimate and unpatriotic.
- 2. Undermine the independence of the courts
- 3. Attack the media ("fake news", enemy of the people).
- 4. Control public broadcasting (state propaganda network).
- 5. Impose stricter controls on the internet.
- 6. Subdue other elements of civil society (civic orgs, universities, and especially anticorruption and human rights groups).
- 7. Intimidate the business community.
- 8. Enrich a new class of crony capitalists (contracts, credit, etc.).
- 9. Assert control over civil service and security apparatus.
- 10. Gerrymander districts and rig electoral rules.
- 11. Gain control over the body that runs the elections.
- 12. Repeat steps 1 to 11, even more vigorously silencing resistance.





A Road to Political Violence?

Political Violence

<u>Harm</u> or <u>intimidation</u> that effects who benefits from or can participate fully in political, economic or sociocultural life.

Risk Factors for Election Violence

- 1. A highly competitive election that could shift the balance of power
- 2. Partisan division based on identity
- 3. Electoral rules that enable winning by exploiting identity cleavage
- 4. Weak institutional restraints on violence (perpetrators not held accountable).


